Rules Governing these Alliance Schools Championships

- 1. These Championships shall be governed by the entry conditions set out below, which may from time to time vary with the Rule Book currently in print.
- 2. Competitors must be Senior Boxers (British or Non-British) and must be registered with the Amateur Boxing Alliance (England) CIC. Competitors must represent the Club on the entry form throughout the Championships. Competitors must be at least 18 years of age at the entry closing date but not older than 40 years of age. They must have had a minimum of 2 Alliance bouts on entry. They must declare numbers of competitive bouts in other combat sports. These numbers must be entered at the top of page 1 on the medical card. Acceptance of entry does not necessarily imply that the entrant is eligible or that he will be allowed to compete. Those in doubt as to their eligibility should refer their case to the Hon. Secretary of their Association, or to the Alliance Office.

 Non-British competitors must have held a medical card for 1 year from the date of their first medical entered in their card.
- 3. The weight entered on the form is the weight the competitor will box in the championship. Once the entry form has been accepted, boxers will not be able to move weights
- 4. The entry form must be signed by the competitor, giving his correct name, date of birth and address. The Hon. Secretary of the competitor's club or organisation must also sign the entry form, to verify that the competitor's details are correct.
- 5. During the 2-hour Weigh in period boxers up to 50kgs category may lose a maximum of 300grams, up to 63kgs-500 grams. and over 63kgs-700 grams. Boxers may have as many check weighs as they wish up to the official closure of the scales.
- 6. Competitors must wear boxing shorts or underpants when weighing-in.
- 7. Gloves all boxers under 63.5kg will wear 10oz and those over 63.5kg will wear 12oz Alliance approved and stamped gloves, supplied by the organisers.
- 8. Competitors may bring their own second who must wear white or plain grey trousers and white vest or white shirt or white sweater. Training shoes or boxing boots must be worn. Tracksuits or white jackets are permitted. No head wear at ringside. Mobile phones must be switched off when at ringside.
- 9. Medical record cards must be produced at the time of time of weighing in at all stages of the Championships.
- 10. For the Pre Quarter Final and Quarter Final matches, appointed Officials will be paid expenses by their own Association. Official's expenses for the Semi Finals and Finals to be paid by the Alliance.
- 11. All boxers shall wear a gum shield, cup protector, Alliance approved bandages on the hands and an Alliance approved and stamped Head-guard when competing. No red gum shields may be worn.
- 12. Where both boxers in the eliminating round of a weight class are disqualified the Association or Associations jointly concerned will be permitted to nominate a representative to the next stage provided the nominee has entered and weighed-in for his Association Championships.
- 13. All participants i.e. boxers and coaches, are reminded that these Championships are subject to the Alliance Anti Doping Rules.
- 14 Scoring clickers SHALL be in operation at all rounds of this championship using 3 ringside judges.
- 14. If there is no opponent for a boxer to compete in the National Final, he will only be awarded the National Title if he has boxed at an earlier stage.
- 15. If necessary, to define the 'belt' line, competitors will be required to wear the appropriate colour sash. No boxer shall wear a RED vest in the BLUE corner or a BLUE vest the RED corner.
- 16. All boxers SHALL wear a RED head guard and gloves in the RED corner and a BLUE head guard and gloves in the BLUE corner.
- 17. All contests will be over 4 x 2 minute rounds.
- 18. All boxers entering and participating in the championships will automatically be upgraded to INTERMEDIATE classification.
- 19. Boxers hair shall be TOTALLY contained within the headguard.
- 20. Completed forms can be posted or emailed to the Alliance Championship Secretary below. Entry fee of £20 per application can be paid by Cheques, made payable to the association where the boxer is registered with i.e. Home Counties ABA, London ABA or South West ABA. If paid by Bank Transfer, a copy of the payment must be enclosed with the application or sent via email attachment to
