Make sure the contact details of your Designated Safeguarding Lead / Welfare Officer are displayed prominently around your club

Posters with these details on should be in public areas and visible to all at your club. Putting the details in areas such as restrooms allow people to access the information in private.

Your Safeguarding Policy should be easily accessible and visible

All those who come to your club should know where and how to access your safeguarding policy. Your club code of conduct should sit alongside your policy and be visible around the club.

Hand over instructions for parents

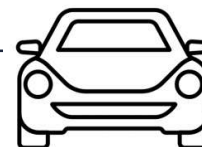
Let parents know what the rules are. Be clear.

Photo and video recording rules

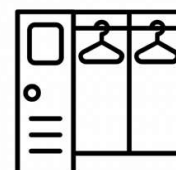
Don't leave parents guessing. Let them know when, how, what's ok and what isn't ok.

Conditions of travel with children under 18

Make sure your club's travel rules are communicated clearly to all on a regular basis.



6.

Changing Room Code of Conduct

Make sure your changing room procedures are clear. When planning consider; the number of adults, gender and age-appropriate supervision.
